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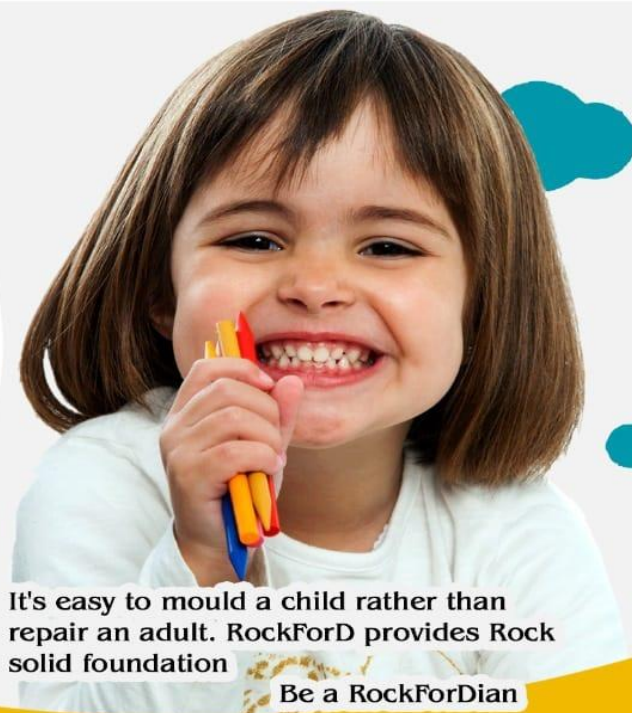

“Hands on Activity”

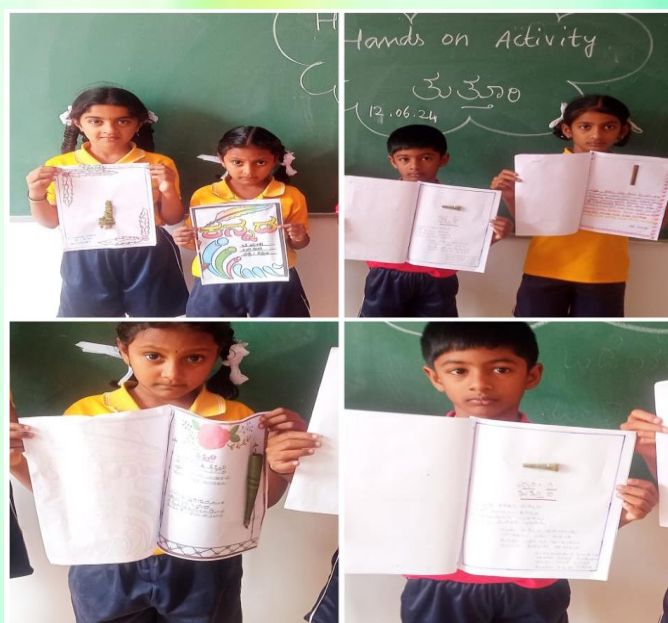
Class: III

Learning is always enjoyable!!!

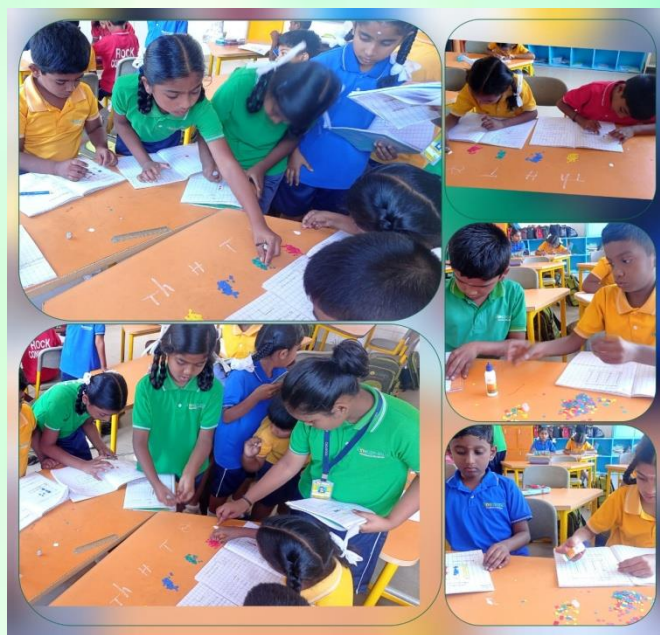


"Place Value"

Subject: Mathematics

In Mathematics, place value charts help us to make sure that the digits are in the correct places. To identify the positional values of numbers accurately, first, we write the digits in the place value chart and then write the numbers in the usual and the standard form. This activity uses the students to understand the place value of four digit numbers.



"Experiential Learning "

Class: IV

Subject: Tamil

3. Creative Expression*: Develop artistic and presentation skills.
4. Research Skills: Learn to collect and document seeds.
5. Environmental Awareness*: Appreciate plant diversity and ecological roles.

"Poster Making"

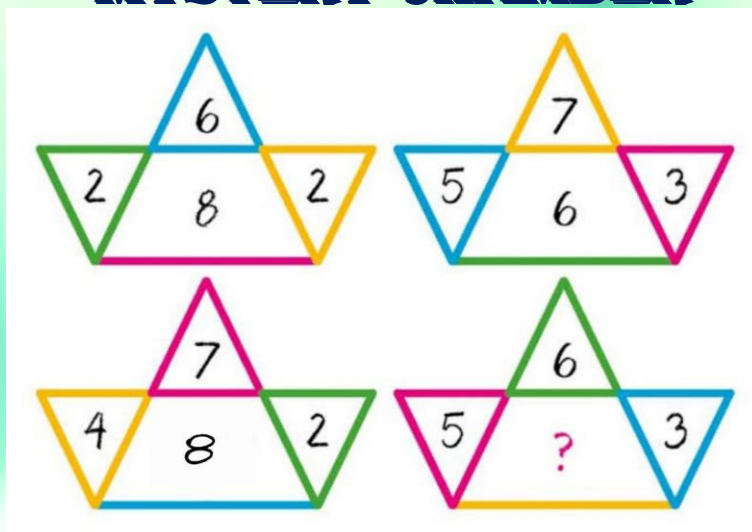
Class: VII

ಯಶೋಧರ ದಾಸಪ್ಪ

ಯಶೋಧರ ದಾಸಪ್ಪ ಅವರು ಭಾರತದ ಕರ್ನಾಟಕದ ಪ್ರಮುಖ ಸ್ವಾತಂತ್ರ್ಯ ಹೋರಾಟಗಾರತಿ ಮತ್ತು ಸಮಾಜ ಸುಧಾರಕರಾಗಿದ್ದರು. ಅವರು ಅಕ್ಟೋಬರ್ 27, 1905 ರಂದು ಧಾರವಾಡದ ಶ್ರೀಮಂತ ಕುಟುಂಬದಲ್ಲಿ, ವಿಶೇಷ ಹಿನ್ನೆಲೆಯಲ್ಲಿ ಜನಿಸಿದರು. ಅವರು ಭಾರತೀಯ ಸ್ವಾತಂತ್ರ್ಯ ಚಳುವಳಿ ಮತ್ತು ಮಹಾತ್ಮ ಗಾಂಧಿಯವರ ವಿಚಾರಗಳಿಂದ ಆಳವಾಗಿ ಪ್ರಭಾವಿತರಾಗಿದ್ದರು. ಅವರು ವಿವಿಧ ಪ್ರತಿಭಟನೆಗಳು ಹಾಗೂ ಮೆರವಣಿಗೆಗಳಲ್ಲಿ ಭಾಗವಹಿಸಿದರು. ಅವರು ಮಹಿಳಾ ಹಕ್ಕುಗಳನ್ನು ಉತ್ತೇಜಿಸಲು ಕೆಲಸ ಮಾಡಿದರು ಮತ್ತು ಮಹಿಳಾ ಶಿಕ್ಷಣ ಮತ್ತು ಸಬಲೀಕರಣದ ಧ್ವನಿಯ ವಕೀಲರಾಗಿದ್ದರು. ಅವರು 1947 ರಲ್ಲಿ ಕರ್ನಾಟಕ ಮಹಿಳಾ ಸೇವಾ ಸಮಾಜವನ್ನು ಸ್ಥಾಪಿಸಿದರು, ಇದು ರಾಜ್ಯದಲ್ಲಿ ಮಹಿಳೆಯರು ಮತ್ತು ಮಕ್ಕಳ ಜೀವನವನ್ನು ಸುಧಾರಿಸುವತ್ತ ಗಮನಹರಿಸಿತು.

Yashodhara Dasappa was a prominent freedom fighter and social reformer of Karnataka, India. She was born on October 27, 1905 in an affluent family of Dharwad, in a privileged background. She was deeply influenced by the Indian freedom movement and the ideas of Mahatma Gandhi. She participated in various protests and processions. She worked to promote women's rights and was a vocal advocate of women's education and empowerment. She founded the Karnataka Mahila Seva Samaj in 1947, which focused on improving the lives of women and children in the state.
